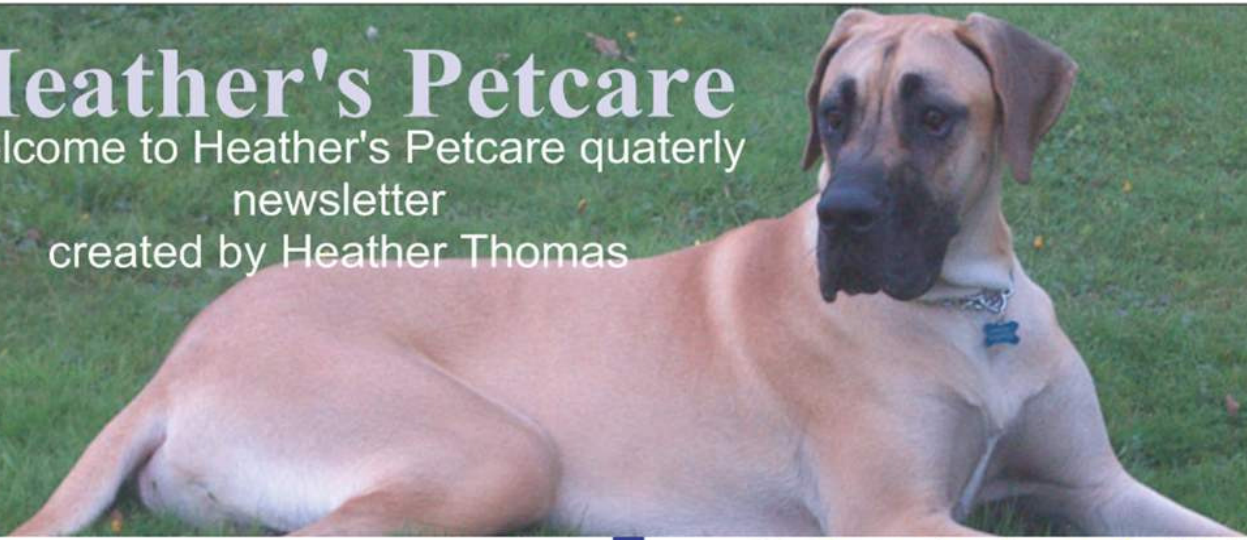

Marley

Thought id better take this oppurtunity to let you all know whats been happening in recent months with Marley. In March Marley was taken to the vet after we were worried about his sight. After an examination the vet found a problem with the reflex's in one eye, she suggested an MRI scan. Marley had the MRI scan a few days later, He started to chomp down hard on one side of his mouth once he was returned, then he didnt look too well and was pacing around the house. I imediatly took him up to the vets with suspected GD or bloat. The vet was unsure but i asked for her to carry out a stomach x-ray. The vet rang me 30 mins later to confirm my worst thoughts.... It was GDV (bloat)

The vet gave Marley a 25% chance of survival but i asked them to go ahead with the procedure. I went down to see him straight after his operation at 1am and i sat with him for a while talking to him. He woke up some 20 mins later, still very much asleep i returned home to get some much needed rest and collected him the next day, Marley was a bit worse for wear and had lost lots of weight, he went from 67kg to 52kg. Marley recovered well from the operation and was another successful GDV case! We had a painful wait for the results his MRI, Marley was fitting around

20 times per day which then got worse to pretty much each time he would lift his head. The results were in our neurologist had told us that Marley has a brain problem and that they thought it was epilepsy, Marley is on pheno barb atone at the moment and has just had another consult with the neurologist, who has suggested 2 more different types of anti seizure medicine. Marley will start these soon and hopefully we will see some improvement.
